Listening for a Lifetime

Selecting fine audio equipment such as the unit you've just purchased is only the start of your musical enjoyment. Now it's time to consider how you can maximize the fun and excitement your equipment offers. VocoPro and the Electronic Industries Association's Consumer Electronics Group want you to get the most out of your equipment by playing it at a safe level. One that lets the sound come through loud and clear without annoying blaring or distortion and, most importantly, without affecting your sensitive hearing.

Sound can be deceiving. Over time your hearing "comfort level" adapts to a higher volume of sound. So what sounds "normal" can actually be loud and harmful to your hearing. Guard against this by setting your equipment at a safe level BEFORE your hearing adapts.

To establish a safe level:

- Start your volume control at a low setting.
- Slowly increase the sound until you can hear it comfortably and clearly, and without distortion.

Once you have established a comfortable sound level:

- Set the dial and leave it there.
- Pay attention to the different levels in various recordings.

Taking a minute to do this now will help to prevent hearing damage or loss in the future. After all, we want you listening for a lifetime.

Used wisely, your new sound equipment will provide a lifetime of fun and enjoyment. Since hearing damage from loud noise is often undetectable until it is too late, this manufacturer and the Electronic Industries Association's Consumer Electronics Group recommend you avoid prolonged exposure to excessive noise. This list of sound levels is included for your protection.

Some common decibel ranges:

- 70 Vacuum cleaner, Hair dryer, Noisy Restaurant
- 80 Average city traffic, Garbage disposals, Alarm clock at 2 ft.


• Connecting to auxiliary inputs on rear panel of DKP-Mix : Use an auxiliary cable to connect audio source output (i.e. MP3 player, SMARTPHONE, TABLET or Laptop headphone jack) to Auxiliary input on DKP-Mix. *in order to hear the audio source, make sure the input dial knob (on front panel of DKP-Mix) is turned to correct input channel setting.




• Connecting to RCA line inputs on rear panel of DKP-Mix: Connect an external audio source here via RCA cable (ex. DVD player, media streaming device)*in order to hear the audio source, make sure the input dial knob (on front panel of DKP-Mix) is turned to correct input channel setting.



 Connecting to RCA Video Output: Connect the yellow connector of a common RCA (red, white, yellow) composite cable to the Video output jack on the rear panel of the DKP-Mix and connect the same connector on the other end of the cable to a "video input" jack of a television monitor.






Opening and Closing the Disc Tray

• Turn the unit power on. Press the OPEN/CLOSE button to open the disc tray. The disc tray can not be opened during playback.


Loading discs

• Hold the disc by the edges and place it in the disc tray, then press the OPEN/CLOSE button again to close the disc tray. CAUTION: Do not place any foreign objects in the disc tray, and do not place more than one disc in the disc tray at a time. Do not push the disc tray in manually when the power is off, as this may result in malfunction and damage to the player.




Selecting Tracks

• Press the SKIP button (|<< >>|) once to move to next or Previous track.







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INSERTING A USB DRIVE

- 1. Insert the USB drive into the USB slot.
 - *Please make sure that the DKP-Mix video output is sending to a display screen such as a television for viewing file navigation.
- 2. Use the CD/USB button to select USB.
- 3. At this point, all cd playback function buttons are enabled for use with the USB flash drive and its files.



*Please note: Display screen, on front panel of DKP-Mix, will only show track number and time elapsed. Any information in regards to song title and or artist will display on the connected video monitor.

- •Selection options for type of media will be shown toward bottom of television screen (i.e. Music, Photos, Movies)
- When the Music playback media option is selected, all music files on the USB drive will be shown with folders on the left half of screen and the individual files, within those folders, on the right
- It is recommended to have all files stored in the root folder of the USB flash drive (no folders within folder) for easy access.
- Use Arrow buttons/enter button on remote to navigate and select desired files
- Program button on remote may be used to automatically play songs in a select sequence. Press Program button on remote and when numbered list appears, enter track numbers in desired order then highlight "play" on the display screen and press the enter button on your remote. Highlighting the clear option and pressing enter on the remote will remove all tracks from the program list.

Set Up Menu

OSD (ON SCREEN DISPLAY) LANGUAGE

- Audio Language: selects the language in which audio will be presented (may require special disc that was previously recorded in multiple languages)
- Subtitle Language: selects the language setting provided by a disc with close captioning
- Menu Language: change the language of the DKP-Mix menus

Audio Out

SPDIF - Adjust these settings when connecting audio output into a digital receiver.

- SPDIF/OFF
- SPDIF/RAW Use when sending audio to 5.1 surround sound receivers.
- SPDIF/PCM Outputs 2 channel stereo

Picture Settings

- Brightness: Increase to make screen produce more light or decrease to dim
- Contrast: Increase to make colors more distinguishable
- Hue: Adjusts colors to their more natural appearance
- Saturation: Adds more grey to the colors present in overall picture
- Sharpness: Adjusts the perceived focus of pictur

DOWNMIX

- LT/RT: This setting controls whether the main audio mix is being sent to the left or right channel output. Using this function with multi-plexed discs could potentially cancel out the vocal track that is recorded on the disc.
- Stereo: Use this setting when there are two or more independently recorded channels on the media (disc/usb file) and you intend to connect at least two loudspeakers.
- VSS: This setting provides a virtual surround sound of the mixed audio output.
- Subwoofer ON/OFF: This setting must be ON if connecting a subwoofer to the DKP-Mix.

OP MODE:

- LINE OUT: Analogue signal setting that has the highest output without need of amplification. Use this setting to have maximum dynamic range.
- RF REMOD: Apply this function to minimize dynamic range and have a more steady output volume (*preferred for quiet listening)
- Dynamic Range: Applying a full setting will allow the user to hear drastic contrasts between the loud and soft portions of the audio. When the dynamic range is lowered, there will be a more consistent volume overall.



DUAL MONO:

- STEREO: Cancels out mono output modes by sending independent audio signal to both left and right channel
- Mono L: Sends single audio signal to be perceived from the left channel
- Mono R: Sends single audio signal to be perceived from the right channel


FRONT PANEL -- LEFT

- 1. Power Use this button to turn the DKP-Mix ON/OFF.
- 2. Mic 1 Input Connect a 1/4" unbalanced microphone here.
- 3. Mic 2 Input Connect a 1/4" unbalanced microphone here.
- 4. Headphone Jack connect a pair of headphones here to monitor all audio from the DKP-Mix
- 5. Headphone Volume adjust this knob to increase or decrease the volume of the audio being sent to headphones.
- 6. Mic 1 Volume This knob alters the Mic 1 input volume.
- 7. Mic 2 Volume This knob alters the Mic 2 input volume.
- 8. Bass This knob alters the low-frequency response of the input music signal.
- 9. Treble This knob alters the mid-level frequency response of the input music signal.
- 10. Delay This knob alters the length of pauses between Echo repeats.
- 11. Mic Effect This knob alters the amount of effects applied to both microphone inputs.
- 12. Music Volume This knob alters the volume of the input music source.
- 13. Input Select This knob selects which input audio will be heard from the output jacks.
- 14 .USB Insert USB drive here.




FRONT PANEL --- RIGHT

- 1. OPEN/CLOSE Press it to open and close the disc tray. The disc tray cannot be opened during playback, so stop playback before pressing the button
- 2. LCD DISPLAY Displays graphical information about playback settings and disc/song time.
- 3. TIME Switches between three settings: Elapsed playing time. Remaining time in the current song. Current total playing time Total remaining time of the disc.
- 4. REPEAT Use this button to replay disc content.
- 5. PLAY/PAUSE Use this button to start playback. Press once to start playback, once again to set the pause mode, and once more to resume playback.
- 6. STOP Press once to immediately cease playback (time elapsed will revert to show the total time of inserted disc) *if playing a cd, the play button will resume playback at the previous moment in time at which the disc was stopped. This short-term memory function is wiped clean (reset) once unit is powered off or disc is removed from tray.
- 7. PGM For creating a custom program list. (See pg. 24 for details)
- 8. TRACK |<< and >>| Use these buttons to skip to the next track (>>|) or jump back to a previous track (|<<). Press the 10+ button to skip ahead 10 tracks
- 9. FAST FORWARD Press and hold to scan forward through currently playing media. REWIND - Press and hold to scan backwards through currently playing media.
- 10. KEY CONTROL- # Button raises the key of music played from either CD or USB Button lowers the key of music played from either CD or USB
- *Note: The Key, of the currently playing song, will only automatically reset (to originally recorded key) when the disc or usb flash drive is removed from the DKP-Mix.
- 11. L/R Effectively cancels out vocals recorded on the center channel of multiplexed discss
- 12 . CD/USB- Press to toggle between primary playback audio source.




BACK PANEL

- 1. INPUT A- Auxiliary connector that allows audio input from external sources via auxiliary cable (ex. Mp3 player, Laptop)
- 2. INPUT B- Connect an external audio source here via auxiliary cable (ex. Mp3 player, Laptop) or RCA cable (ex. DVD player, media streaming device)
- 3. Unbalanced RCA Line out Non-amplified audio ouptut
- 4. XLR Output Balanced stereo output
- Note: Use the input selector knob, on the front panel, to change which audio input bank (Input A or Input B) you hear as the primary audio source. The Input A+B selection allows for a total of two auxiliary inputs and one RCA input to be heard simultaneously.



REMOTE

- 1. Eject: Press this button, when inserting or removing a disc, to open or close the disc loading tray.
- 2. CD/USB: Press this button to toggle between CD player or USB reader as the main audio source.
- 3. Display: This function will provide current track information on your connected video monitor.
- 4. 1-9: Use these buttons to make specific track number selections
- 5. Program: You can program up to 16 tracks on a CD or chapters in a movie to play in a custom order. (Pg. 24)
- 6. Mute: Temporarily disables all audio output from the DKP-Mix
- 7. Key: B $-\frac{1}{2}$ (flat key) lowers the key of cd/usb track one half-step increment
 - 4 (natural key) returns music to it's original key
 - # (sharp key) raises the key of cd/usb track one half-step increment
- 8. Menu Returns the user to the original menu
- 9. Setup Prompts a menu with various advance functions (see set-up menu page)
- 10. (Play/Pause button) use to temporarily cease cd/usb playback or press once more to resume
- 11. Arrows and Enter Buttons These buttons allow the user to navigate through menus and apply different functions allotted by the DKP-Mix
- 12. (Previous button) Press once to return to the beginning of the currently playing track or press twice in rapid Succession to navigate to the previous track/chapter.
- 13. (Next button) Press to skip forward to next track/chapter
- 14. Repeat enable to have the DKP-Mix replay the currently playing track, once finished.
- 15. (Rewind button) Press and hold to revert to a previous moment in time, within the track/ movie being played
- (Fast forward button) Press and hold to skip forward through the currently playing track/ movie.
- 17. L/R Toggles whether audio output is sent from the left, right or both channels.
 * If using a multi-plex formatted disc, this button may be used to essentially cancel track vocals



Advance Remote Options

PROGRAMMING TRACKS/CHAPTERS:

1. Press the PROGRAM button on the remote or PGM button (See pg.10 #7) to access the program menu.


2. In each empty numbered slot, enter the track number that you want to play

(the lowest numbered slot filled in will be the first to play)

- Note: For tracks 1-9 simply press the individual number on the remote, you do not have to press O first.
- 3. Highlight the Play button within the menu and press enter

- To remove programmed tracks, highlight CLEAR and press enter

Note: The only tracks to now play will be the ones you have selected, in the order you have selected. Pressing the next button will cycle through the tracks you have set in the program list only.



- * Pressing stop during program play will revert disc playback to sequential play (denoted on screen by SEQ PLAY) however, the program list does not clear. Simply enter program list and press play to use previously composed program list.
- * Ejecting the disc will revert disc playback to sequential play and also clear custom input from program list.

Troubleshooting

There is no power

- Make sure the power cord is firmly connected to the power outlet.
- If using a power strip/surge-protector, make sure that it is plugged in and switched on.
- *Please be advised that it is safe practice to power the DKP-Mix on in the following fashion:
 - 1. Always make sure the DKP-Mix power switch is in an off position
 - 2. Plug the power adapter into the "DC In" receptacle on the rear panel
 - 3. Plug DC power adapter into wall outlet or surge protector/power strip
 - 4. Press Power button on front of DKP-Mix.

There is no sound (audio output)

- Make sure everything is connected firmly and properly.
- Make sure there are no defective cables.
- The Disc player audio output is always present in all audio output jacks when the disc is playing. If you are using an external audio source then make sure the "input dial knob" is set to the correct input channel (A or B)
- Make sure all of your audio input sources (i.e. Mp3 player/laptop hardwired via auxiliary cable) to the DKP-Mix are powered on and sending an adequate audio signal.
- Make sure all of the components (amp, mixer, TV, etc.) are set to the proper inputs.

There is no sound (Headphones)

- Turn headphone volume knob clockwise to the right (see Descriptions and functions Front Panel #5)
- Check that the headphone cable wire is not faulty: A faulty wire is detected when audio seems to only be heard when the wire is turned and or twisted at a specific orientation.
- High impedance variety headphones may require the audio source (DKP-Mix) to be turned up a little more (check headphone specs to see that they do not require a separate headphone amplifier)

There is no sound (Microphone)

- Check that the microphone cable is firmly connected into the microphone and that the other end of the cable is firmly inserted completely into either of the microphone input jacks on the front of the DKP-Mix
- Increase microphone volume by turning corresponding MIC Vol Knob clockwise to the right (see Descriptions and functions Front Panel # 6 & 7)
- If your microphone requires phantom power, it may not be compatible to use with the DKP-Mix (see technical specifications)

Troubleshooting

The disc does not play or is skipping

- Make sure the disc is inserted correctly (label-side up).
- Make sure the disc is clean and not scratched.
- If using a CD-R/RW, try using a different brand as some brands might not be compatible.
- When creating a CD-R make sure not to solely write a data-disc and that the file format chosen is one compatible for the DKP-Mix's reading capability (see features pg)
- Clean the CD lens using a CD lens cleaner.
- If the disc is a CD+G, make sure the player is not bumped or shaken, as the anti-skip feature does not function with CD+Gs.
- Make sure that the DKP-Mix sits on a level surface with no upward or downward tilt


There is no Video

- Replace RCA cable with one that is not faulty
- Check video system switch setting (see Back Panel on Descriptions and Functions pg) *NTSC is the correct setting for USA
- If connecting to a television video input, make sure the television is set to the correct input channel (i.e. AV1,AV2, AUX)
- Make sure all cables are firmly attached at all input/output connectors
- Restart DKP-Mix
