- 1. To ensure the finest performance, please read this manual carefully. Keep it in a safe place for future
- 2. Install your unit in a cool, dry, clean place away from windows, heat sources, and too much vibration, dust, moisture or cold. Avoid sources of hum (transformers, electric motors). To prevent fire or electrical shock, do not expose to rain and water.
- 3. Do not operate the unit upside-down.
- 4. Never open the cabinet. If a foreign object drops into the set, contact your dealer.
- 5. Place the unit in a location with adequate air circulation. Do not interfere with its proper ventilation; this will cause the internal temperature to rise and may result in a failure.
- **6.** Do not use force on switches, knobs or cords. When moving the unit, first turn the unit off. Then gently disconnect the power plug and the cords connecting to other equipment. Never pull the cord itself.





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

One that lets the sound come through loud and clear without annoying blaring or distortion and, most importantly, without affecting your sensitive hearing.

Sound can be deceiving. Over time your hearing "comfort level" adapts to a higher volume of sound. So what sounds "normal" can actually be loud and harmful to your hearing. Guard against this by setting your equipment at a safe level BEFORE your hearing adapts.





General Operations

When the SD card is inserted in the DKP-3, the compatible files will be sorted into three categories: Music, Pictures, ad Video. Files of the same category will be listed sequentially no matter what folder they might be held in on the SD card. Always use the number automatically assigned by the DKP-3 for any playlist or Go-To entries.

SETTING UP A PLAYLIST

- 1. Press the playlist button.
- Use the number pad to enter tracks. Press the Playlist button to confirm their addition to the list.
- Repeat, for up to 30 tracks.
- Press Play to initiate the playlist. - At any point during playback, it is possible to press the Playlist button again to edit the playlist.
 - Only files from the *same category* (music, pictures, or video) can be added to the current playlist.
- Flies of the same category but different playback folder can be added to the playlist.


