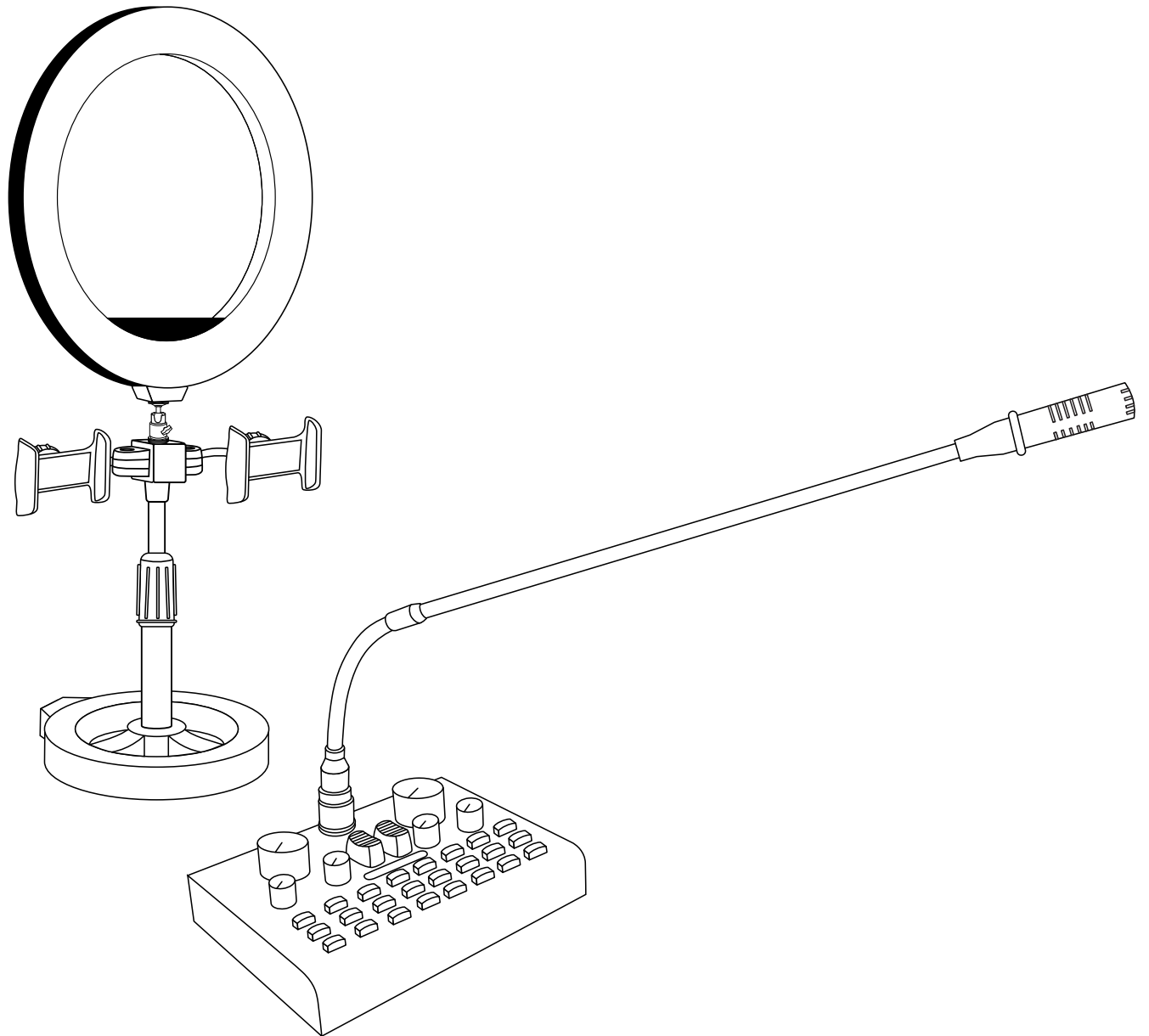

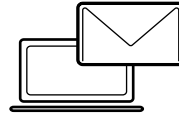

Listening for a Lifetime

Selecting fine audio equipment such as the unit you've just purchased is only the start of your musical enjoyment. Now it's time to consider how you can maximize the fun and excitement your equipment offers. VocoPro and the Electronic Industries Association's Consumer Electronics Group want you to get the most out of your equipment by playing it at a safe level. One that lets the sound come through loud and clear without annoying blaring or distortion and, most importantly, without affecting your sensitive hearing.

Sound can be deceiving. Over time your hearing "comfort level" adapts to a higher volume of sound. So what sounds "normal" can actually be loud and harmful to your hearing. Guard against this by setting your equipment at a safe level BEFORE your hearing adapts.

To establish a safe level:

- Start your volume control at a low setting.
- Slowly increase the sound until you can hear it comfortably and clearly, and without distortion.

Once you have established a comfortable sound level:

- Set the dial and leave it there.
- Pay attention to the different levels in various recordings.

Taking a minute to do this now will help to prevent hearing damage or loss in the future. After all, we want you listening for a lifetime.

Used wisely, your new sound equipment will provide a lifetime of fun and enjoyment. Since hearing damage from loud noise is often undetectable until it is too late, this manufacturer and the Electronic Industries Association's Consumer Electronics Group recommend you avoid prolonged exposure to excessive noise. This list of sound levels is included for your protection.

Level	Example
30	Quiet library, Soft whispers
40	Living room, Refrigerator, Bedroom away from traffic
50	Light traffic, Normal Conversation
60	Air Conditioner at 20 ft., Sewing machine
70	Vacuum cleaner, Hair dryer, Noisy Restaurant
80	Average city traffic, Garbage disposals, Alarm clock at 2 ft.

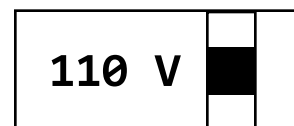
electric motors). To prevent fire or electrical shock, do not expose to rain and water.

3. Do not operate the unit upside-down.
4. Never open the cabinet. If a foreign object drops into the set, contact your dealer.
5. Place the unit in a location with adequate air circulation. Do not interfere with its proper ventilation; this will cause the internal temperature to rise and may result in a failure.

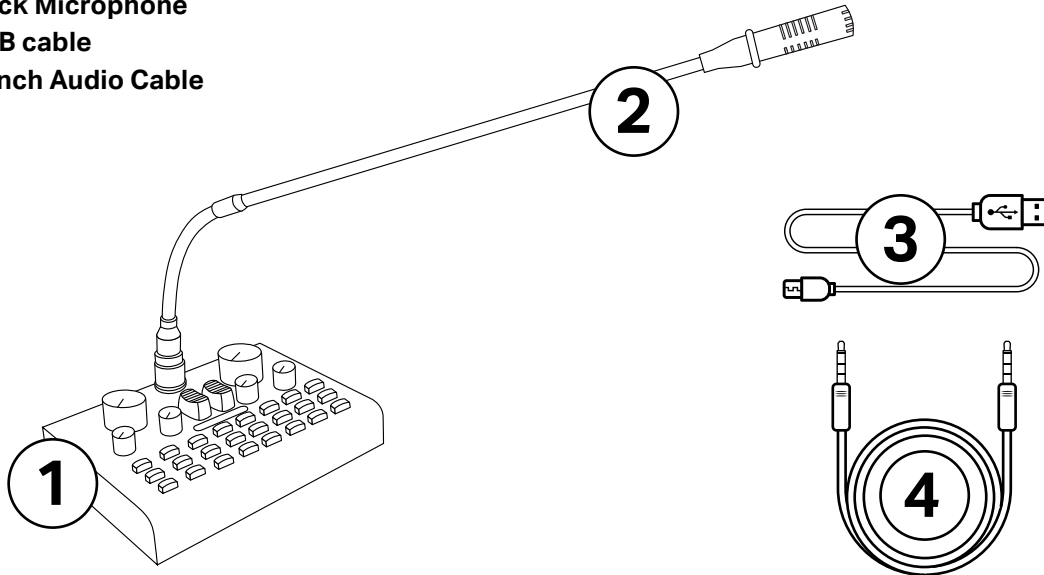

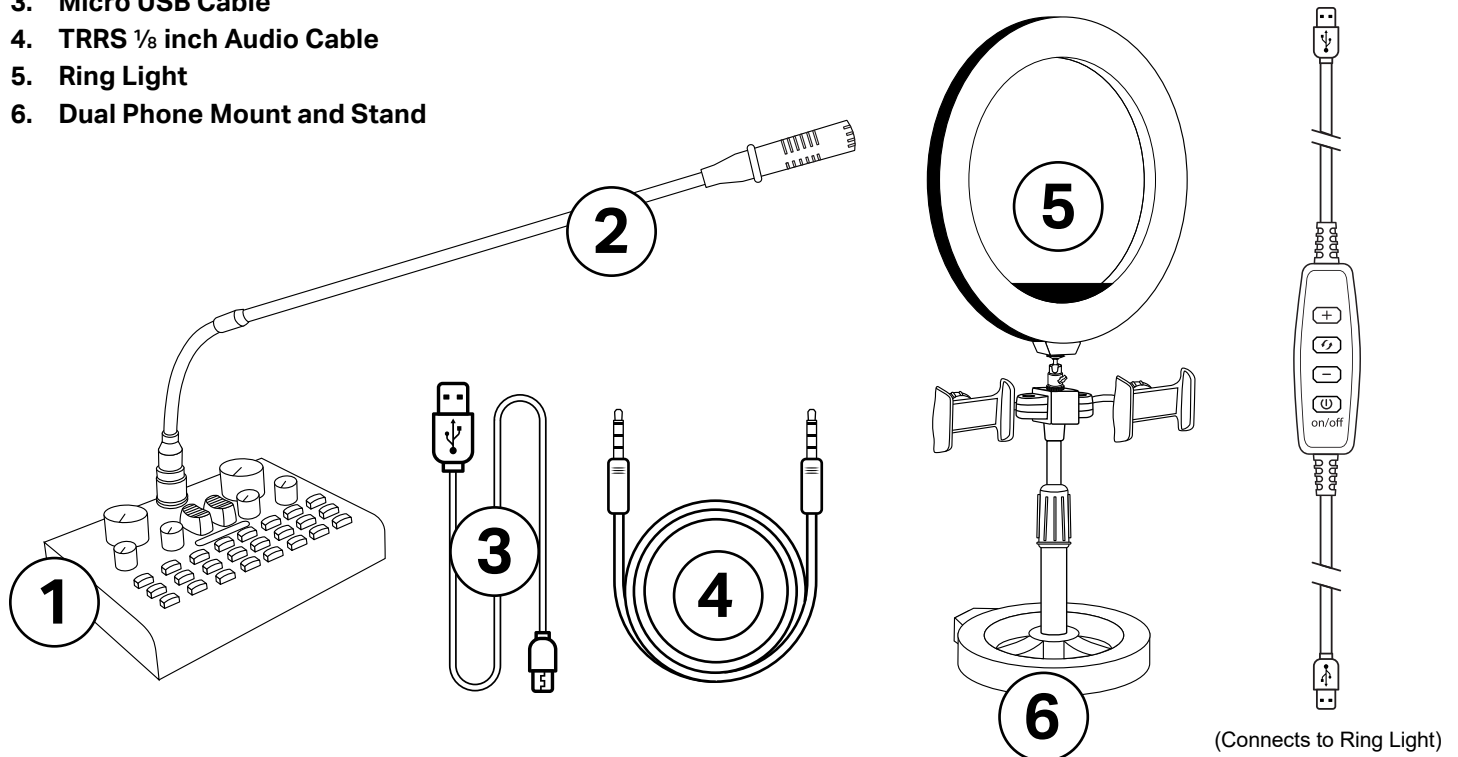

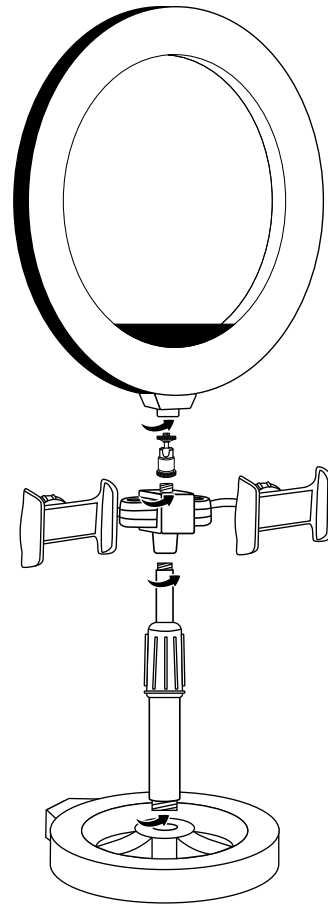

Assembling the Streamer Desktop Lid Stand

1. Screw the height adjustable pole into the base.
2. Screw on the Dual Phone holder with adjustable mounts
3. Screw on the adjustable ball bearing, this will allow you to angle the LED ring light.
4. Screw on the LED ring light.
5. Plug the red end of the USB control cable into the ring light, and plug the other end into power via a USB wall plug or into a USB power bank.

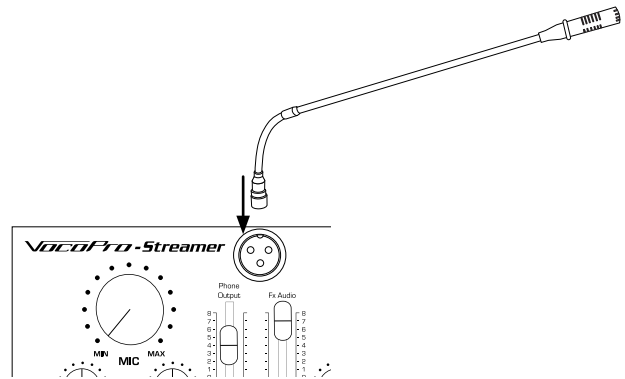

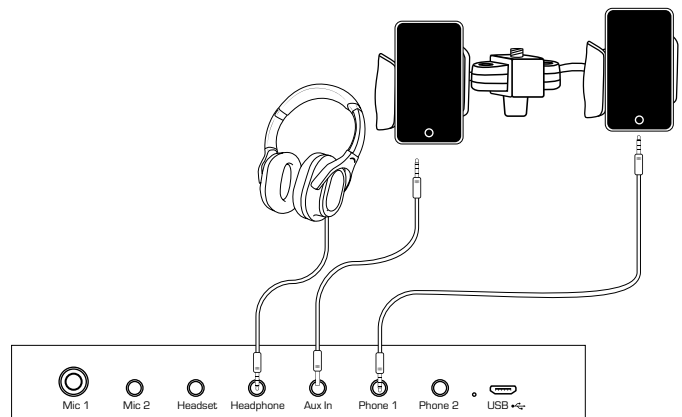
Setting up the Streamer Desktop Vlog for use with Phones

Here we will go over an example of how to connect to a phone for recording, or streaming through a social media app. This example will use multiple devices which will allow you to take advantage of the dual phone mount and stand included in the Streamer Desktop Vlog package.

1. Connect the gooseneck microphone to the XLR input jack on the top panel. If you want to use another mic, you can connect a dynamic mic to the Mic 1 input, or a condenser mic to the Mic 2 input which will provide phantom power.



2. Connect a pair of headphones to the Headphone output to listen to music playback.

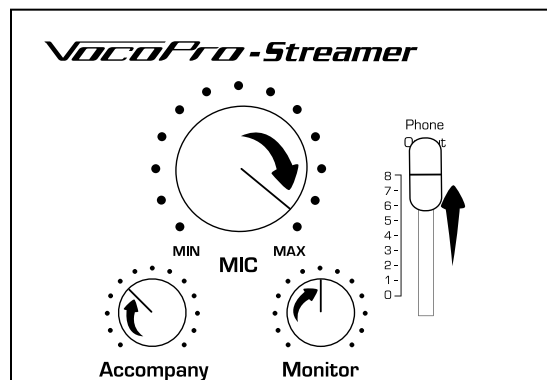


3. Connect a phone/ laptop/ MP3 player to the Aux In for music playback using the TRRS 1/8 inch Audio Cable. Connecting to the Aux In will allow you to control the music volume with the Accompany knob, as well as allow you to take advantage of the Vocal Eliminator and Talk Over functions.

4. Connect a phone to the Phone 1 input/output jack for recording or streaming using the TRRS 1/8 inch Audio Cable. If your phone does not have a headphone jack you will need an adapter made by the phone's manufacturer.

5. Turn on the Streamer USB.
6. Turn the Phone Output volume up high to ensure you are sending a strong signal to the Phone outputs
7. Turn the Mic volume knob up high to ensure you are sending strong signal to the phone.
8. Turn the Monitor knob up to a comfortable listening volume.
9. Turn the Accompany volume up to match the music volume to your performance.
10. Open the camera app to record onto your phone, or open the recording/ streaming app of your choice.
11. Hit Record and GO!



Helpful Tips:

If you want to use the ring light it will need to be plugged into power via a USB wall plug or USB battery pack.

If you want to add a second singer or instrument player into the mix, simply connect a dynamic microphone (that does not require phantom power), or an instrument to the Mic 1 input on the Streamer USB using a ¼ inch audio cable.

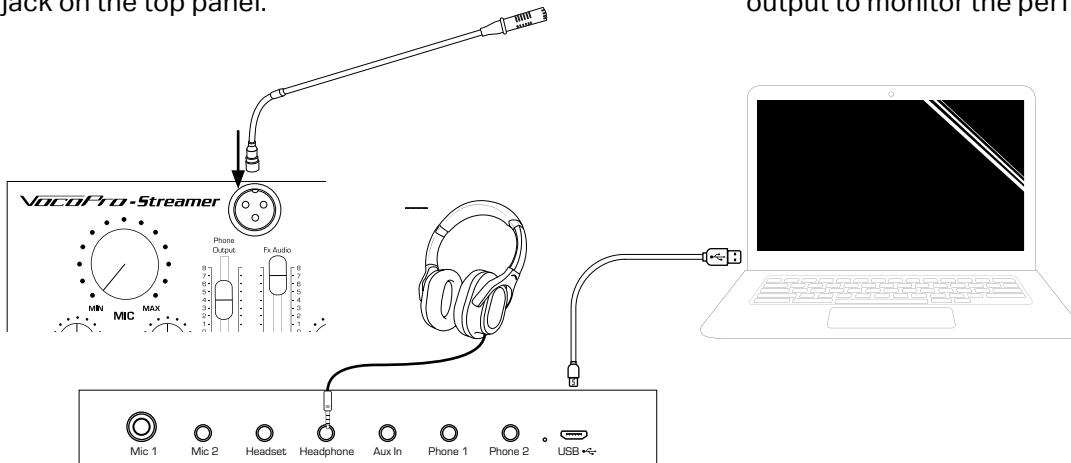
Getting Connected

Assembling the Streamer Desktop for use with a Computer

Here we will go over an example of how to connect to a computer to record vlogs, voice-overs, vocal performances, etc. You can also use this method to connect to a computer to use the microphone during virtual meetings and video conferences.

1. Connect the gooseneck microphone to the XLR input jack on the top panel.

2. Connect a pair of headphones to the Headphone output to monitor the performance.



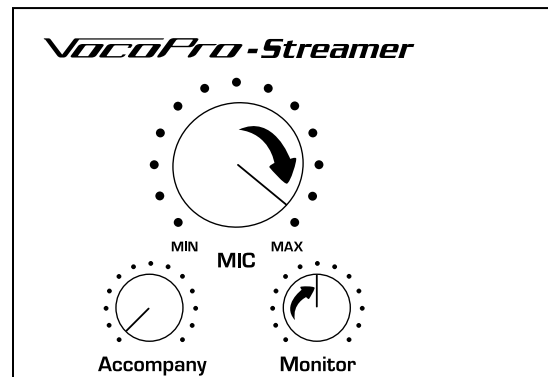
You may need to go into your computer's System Settings or System Preferences and go to the Sound settings and change the Input Device and Output Device. For many computers this will be done automatically upon connecting and turning on the Streamer USB.

3. Connect the Streamer USB to your computer using the Micro USB cable, and power it on.

4. Open the Recording application of your choice on the computer.

5. Turn the Mic volume knob up high to ensure you are sending strong signal to the computer.

6. Turn the Monitor knob up to a comfortable listening volume.

Getting Connected: Streamer to Computer for Virtual Meetings

If you use the instructions on the last page to connect the Streamer to your computer, you can also use the Streamer with its microphone during virtual meetings. Here we will cover changing your input and output settings for your computer.

You must change the Input device for the computer to accept the audio coming from the microphone. On the Input list you want to select the device listed as "USB 2.0 Device".

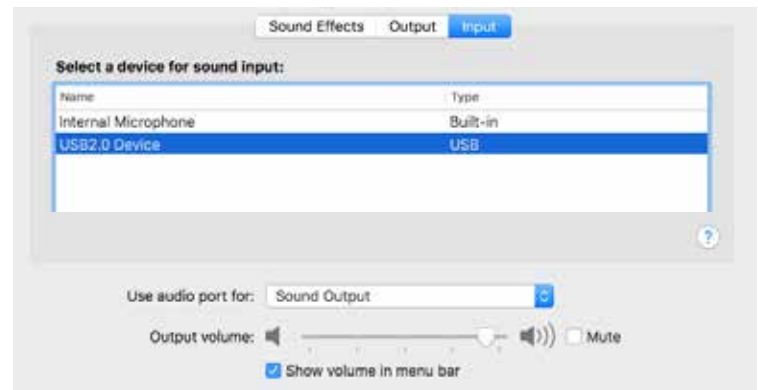

For the Output device, if it is set to Speakers, the audio from your computer will continue to come out of the computer's speakers. If you set the Output device to the USB 2.0 Device, the audio from the computer will be sent to the Streamer, and you will need to connect a pair of headphones to the Headphone output on the Streamer.

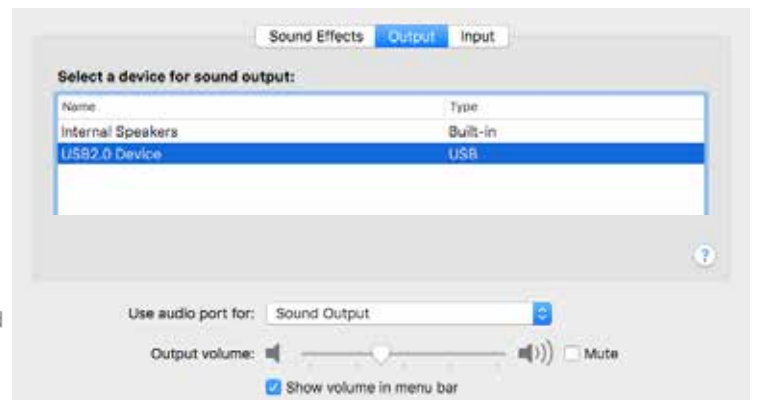

Please note, your microphone audio will not come out of the computer speakers, regardless of your output setting. You will hear yourself if you are using headphones connected to the Streamer.

Changing the Mic Input in Common Video Applications

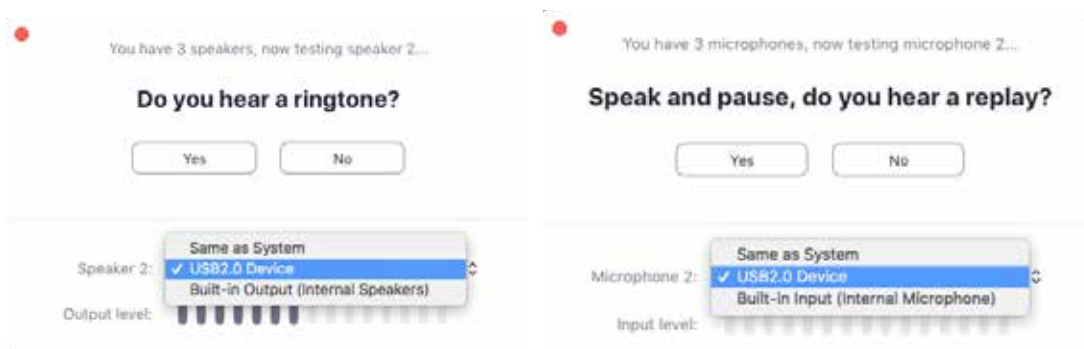
Below we will go over some of the common software apps and where you can change the mic input settings within those apps if needed. Just like with the computer itself, many of the apps we use will automatically change the input source, but here is what to look for if you have issues.

Zoom

The most popular video conference app of 2020, Zoom will actually perform a step by step set-up with you to select your output and input if you select "Test Speaker and Microphone" before joining a meeting.

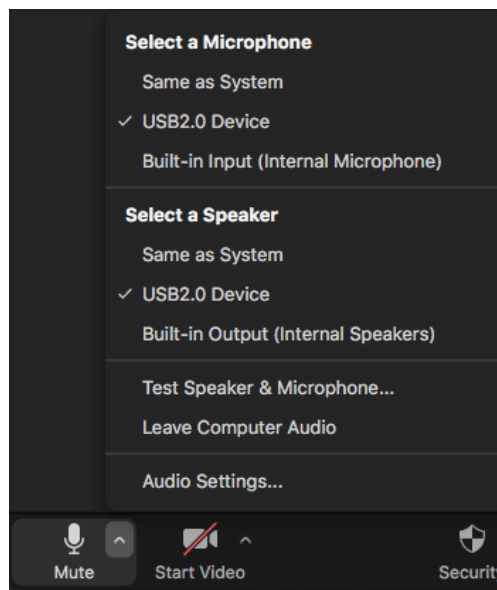
For speakers (output) set to USB 2.0 Device if you want to hear the audio through headphones connected to the streamer.

If you've already changed your computer's input and output device as stated on the previous page of this manual, you can also select "Same as System".



Speak into the microphone briefly, you should see the microphone meter light up, and it will playback your voice for the purpose of testing the mic.

If you need to change the mic input while you are already in a meeting for any reason, look for the microphone symbol on the bottom left of the Zoom window. Click the up arrow to bring up a menu and see your current microphone and speaker selections. Select "USB2.0 Device" for your microphone, or if you have changed the input setting for your computer you can select "Same as System"

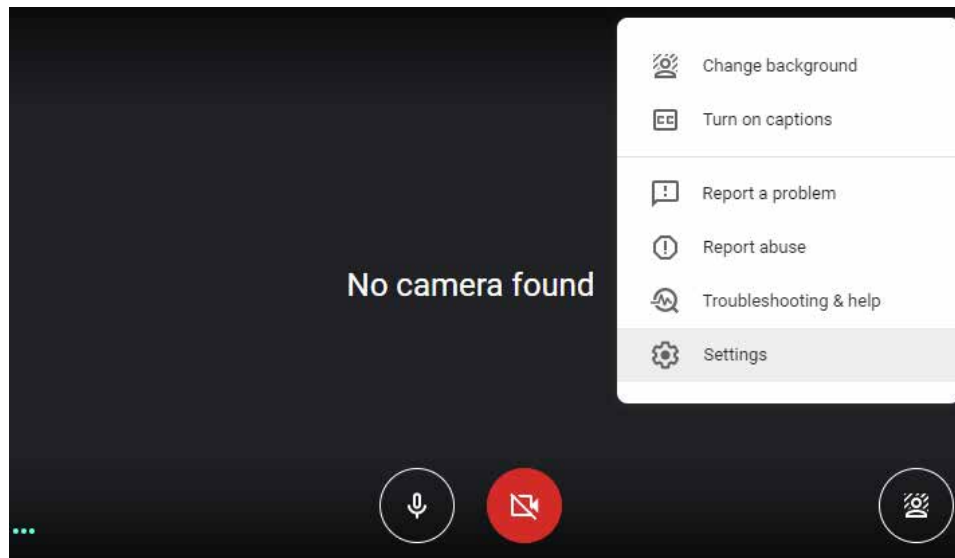

Google Meet

Recently made available free to all, Google Meet is a video conference software you can run directly on your computer's web browser, no need to download and install a separate application.

To change the microphone input, first open the menu by clicking on the three vertical dots, then select settings. Before joining a meeting, the dots to access the menu will be on the top right of the window, after joining they will be on the bottom right.



Once you are in the audio settings, under Microphone there will be a drop-down menu, make sure "USB2.0 Device" is selected. Once selected, when you speak into the mic the small meter to the right should move showing it is receiving the signal.

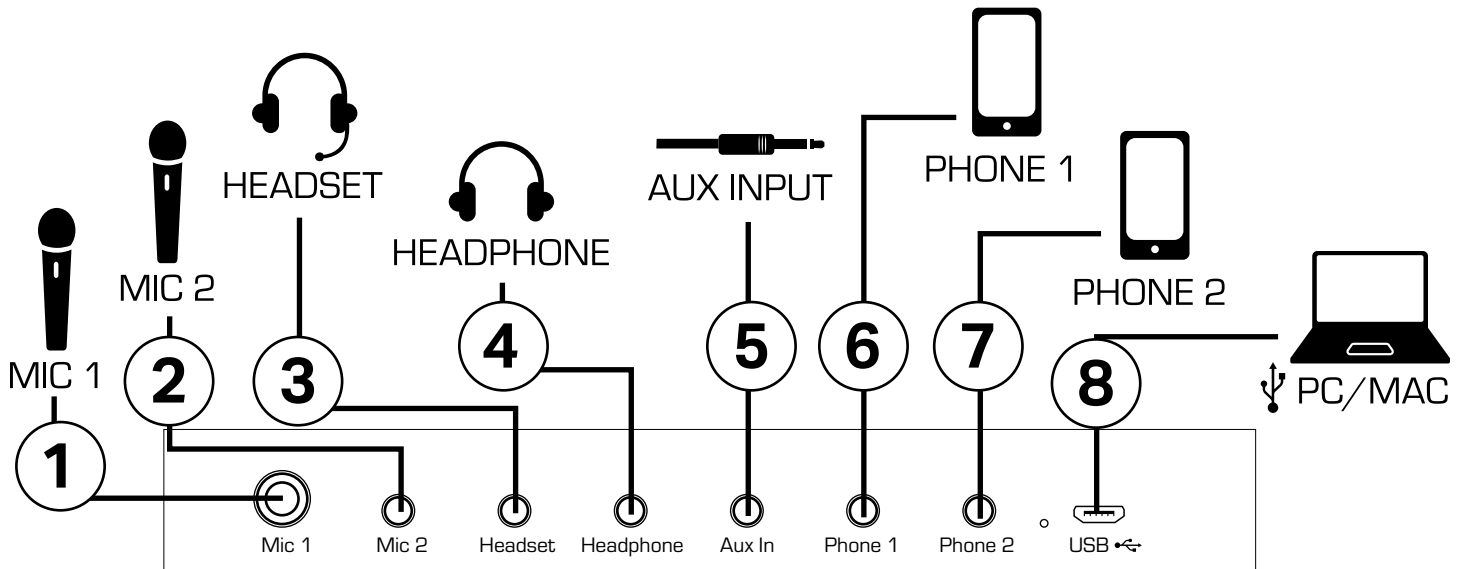
Facetime

An apple exclusive software, Facetime comes pre-installed on all iPhones and Mac computers. If everyone in your group is on an Apple device, Facetime is a perfectly fine application to use for group video calls.

After you open Facetime on your Mac, on the toolbar at the top of the screen, click on Video to drop down a menu. In this menu there is Microphone section where you can select your option. Make sure to select "USB2.0 Device". This menu can be accessed before or after joining a call.



Functions/Controls



Streamer USB Rear Panel

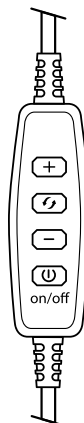
1. **Mic 1:** $\frac{1}{4}$ inch input for dynamic microphones and instruments.
2. **Mic 2:** $\frac{1}{8}$ inch input for condenser mics that require phantom power.
3. **Headset:** $\frac{1}{8}$ inch input/output jack for a stereo headset mic.
4. **Headphone:** $\frac{1}{8}$ inch output for headphone monitoring.
5. **Aux In:** $\frac{1}{8}$ inch input for line level sources such as a phone or laptop.
6. **Phone 1:** $\frac{1}{8}$ inch input/output for connecting a phone.
7. **Phone 2:** $\frac{1}{8}$ inch input/output for connecting a phone.
8. **USB:** Micro USB connection to connect to a computer. You can also charge the internal battery by connecting it to a computer, outlet, or power bank.
9. **Bluetooth:** The streamer is always Bluetooth enabled when powered on. When you open Bluetooth settings on your device it will be listed as VP streamer. Connect with your device and control the volume with the Accompany knob.

****Note--** When playing media while connected to either of the phone inputs, use controls on the phone to set the incoming volume.

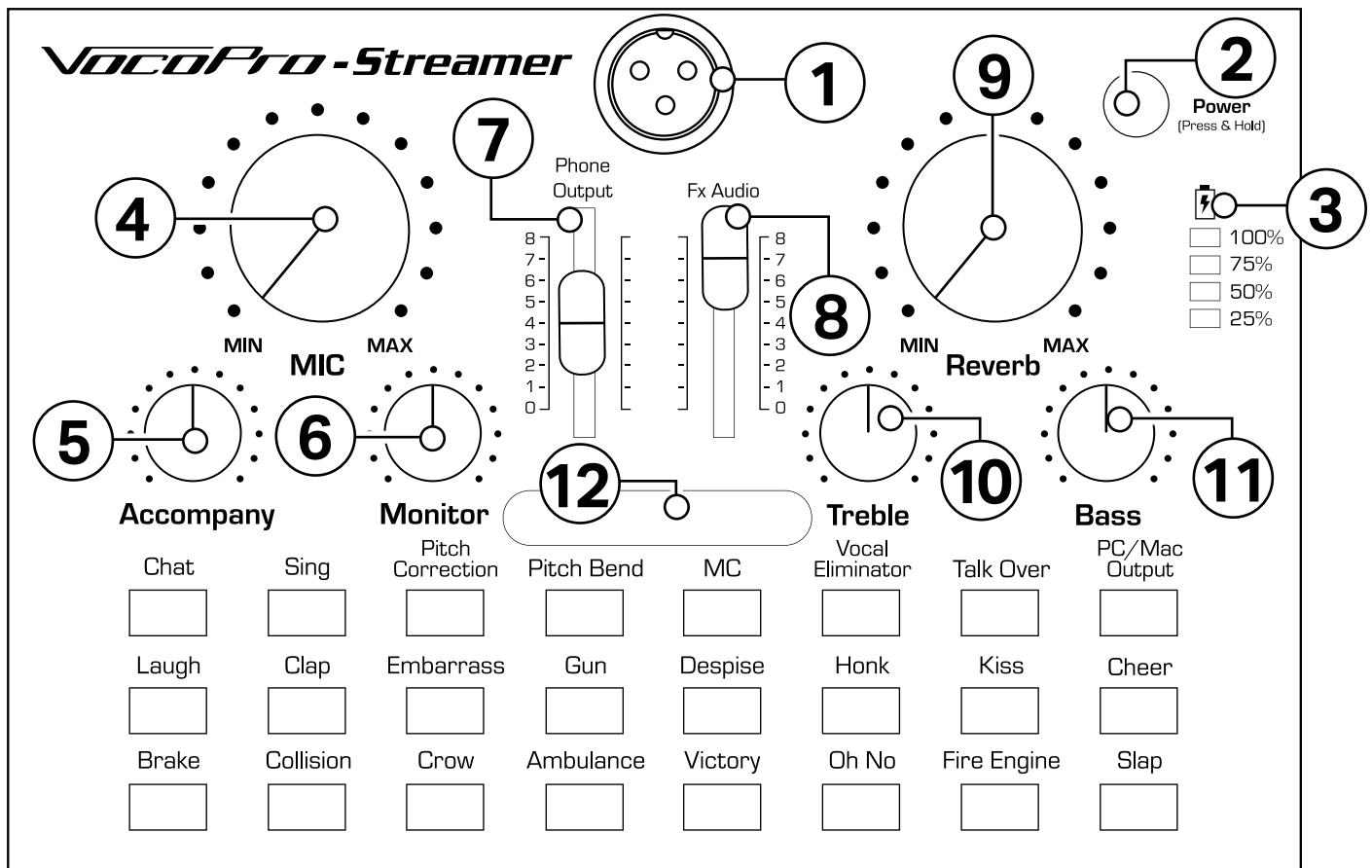
Controls for Ring Light

- ⏻ Turn light on and off.



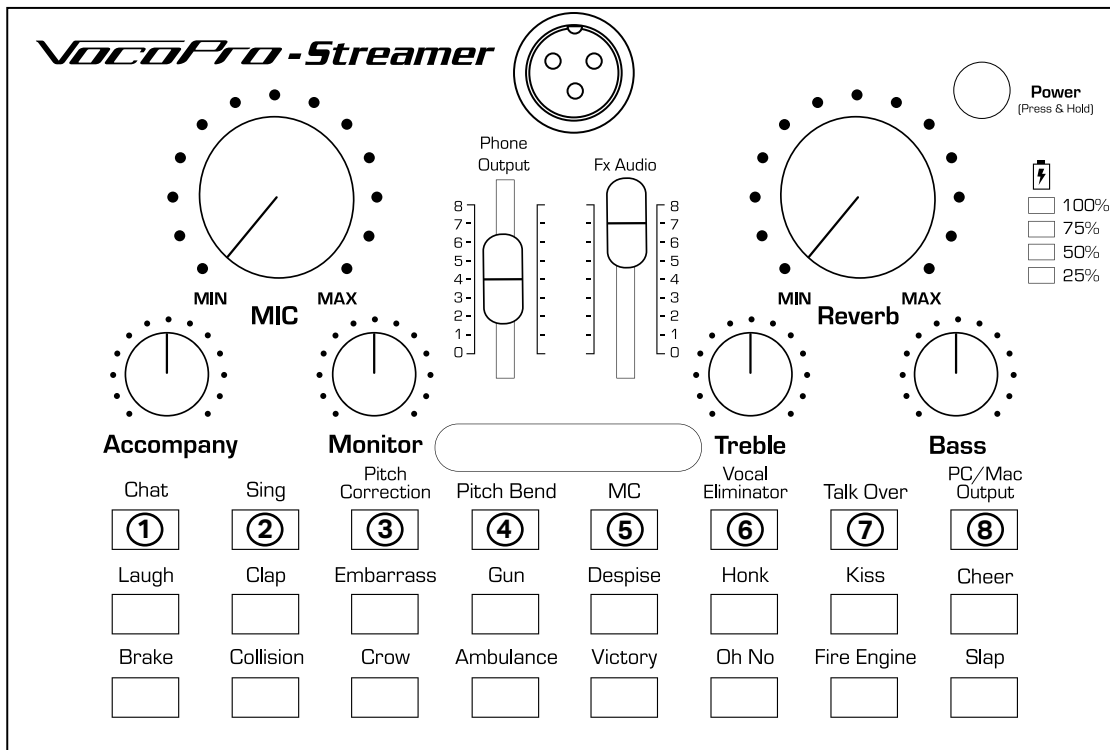
Functions/Controls



Streamer USB Top Panel

- 1. XLR Input:** Connect the included gooseneck microphone to this threaded XLR connector.
- 2. Power:** Hold to turn the Streamer on and off.
- 3. Battery:** These lights indicate how much power is left in the internal battery. When charging the battery, the lights will flash. If all lights are solid, the battery is fully charged.
- 4. MIC:** Volume control for sources plugged into the Mic 1, Mic 2, and Headset inputs.
- 5. Accompany:** Volume control for source plugged into the Aux In, or connected via Bluetooth.
- 6. Monitor:** Volume control for the Headphone and Headset outputs.
- 7. Phone Output:** Volume control for the output through the Phone 1 and Phone 2 jacks.
- 8. FX Audio:** Volume control for the built-in effects through all outputs.
- 9. Reverb:** Controls the amount of reverb added to the Mic 1, Mic 2, and Headset inputs.
- 10. Treble:** Use to increase or decrease the treble for the microphone audio.
- 11. Bass:** Use to increase or decrease the bass for the microphone audio.
- 12. Power Indicator:** The light will flash green and blue when the unit is on.

Functions/Controls



Streamer USB Top Panel

- 1. Chat:** Setting to Chat will have a natural EQ applied to your voice and disable the reverb.
- 2. Sing:** Setting to Sing will have a natural EQ applied to your voice and the reverb will be enabled.
- 3. Pitch Correction:** Press the pitch correction button to cycle through keys, starting with C major. If you have the FX Audio volume up, a voiceover will tell you what key you are in. Set the pitch correction to the key of your song and it will correct your pitch to the closest note in that key. Reverb will become enabled.
- 4. Pitch Bend:** Press to cycle through 4 pitch bending settings. Very high, high, very low, and low. The Pitch Bend setting has its own reverb applied and will disable the reverb setting on the Streamer.
- 5. MC:** Setting to MC will have a bass-heavy EQ and a different reverb applied to your voice.

** (Please note the above vocal effect buttons will flash when you are connected to the device via Bluetooth)

- 6. Vocal Eliminator:** Turning on the vocal eliminator will attempt to remove the vocals from the music playing through the Aux In or Bluetooth only. Vocals are almost entirely made up of mid-range frequencies. This setting will remove most mid-range frequencies from the music. This will eliminate all or most of the vocals, but the music is affected by the EQ as well.
- 7. Talk Over:** Turning on the Talk Over function will turn down the music playing through the Aux In or Bluetooth only, when you speak into the microphone. There is a threshold to activate Talk Over, meaning if you speak quietly into the microphone it will not activate.
- 8. PC/Mac Output:** When connected to a computer for recording, turning this on will allow you to record audio that is playing from the computer. If you are playing a song on your computer and want to record the music along with the vocals, turn this on. If you are singing to a pre-recorded track and want to record the vocals only, keep this off.

There are 16 pre-recorded sound effects built into the Streamer Interface. Plug in a pair of headphones, turn up the FX Audio, and try them for yourself!

Troubleshooting/FAQ

For many of the Troubleshooting tips below, we recommend to have headphones plugged in and the Monitor knob turned up so you can make sure audio is going through the Streamer USB.

The Streamer USB will not power on or stay on.

To turn the streamer USB on you must hold the power button for 2-3 seconds.

The battery indicator lights will show how much power the internal battery has, see if it needs to be charged. If you plug it into power and all 4 lights are flashing the power is very low.

The Streamer USB will not charge.

The Streamer USB can charge while connected to, and interfacing with, your computer. Occasionally it may connect but not charge the battery, simply disconnect and reconnect the Micro USB cable to the Streamer USB and it should begin to charge.

The Streamer USB is connected to the computer but I hear no audio from the computer.

You may need to go into your computer's System Settings or System Preferences and go to the Sound settings and change the Output Device. For many computers this will be done automatically upon connecting and turning on the Streamer USB.

The Streamer USB is connected to the computer but I get no audio when recording into my recording software/ DAW.

You may need to go into your computer's System Settings or System Preferences and go to the Sound settings and change the Input Device. For many computers this will be done automatically upon connecting and turning on the Streamer USB.

I have no microphone audio or the mic sounds odd.

Ensure the mic is connected to the Streamer USB, turned on, and MIC volume is turned up.

If you are using one of the condenser microphones that come with these packages, ensure it is connected to the 1/8 inch Mic 2 input which supplies phantom power.

If you are using a dynamic mic, connect it to the 1/4 inch Mic 1 input.

I cannot hear the built in FX or the Pitch Correction's voice over.

Ensure the FX Audio slider is turned up. It must be up to hear those effects, even through the headphones.

The audio going through the Streamer USB is not recording onto the phone.

Ensure you are using a TRRS 1/8 inch audio cable like the one included in the box. If you are using an 1/8 inch adapter to your phone's input such as Apple's Lightning to 3.5mm(1/8 inch) adapter, make sure it is a certified product. The Phone Output slider must be up to send audio through the Phone 1 and 2 connections.

Sometimes the phone will still default back to using the internal microphone for the input. Even if you can play audio from the phone and monitor with headphones, it may still try to record using the phone's internal mic. We recommend to try disconnecting and reconnecting the cable at the end to the Streamer USB and at the end to the phone.

Here is a quick way to test the connection before starting a long recording: Open your camera to take a video. Ensure everything is connected and the FX Audio and Phone Output sliders are both up. Hit record on your phone, play an effect, and stop. If you can hear the effect in your video, you are good to go for recording or streaming through any app on your phone.

WARRANTY PROCEDURE

Therefore any warranty correspondence or inquiries MUST include the model and serial number of the product in question. Be sure to fill in the model and serial number in the space provided below and keep this portion of the warranty card in a safe place for future reference.

WARRANTY SERVICE MUST BE PERFORMED ONLY BY AN AUTHORIZED VOCOPRO SERVICE FACILITY LOCATED IN THE COUNTRY WHERE THE UNIT WAS PURCHASED, OR AT THE VOCOPRO HEADQUARTERS IN THE U.S. It is recommended that advance notice be given to the repair facility to avoid needless shipment in case the problem can be solved over the phone.
